





- Jumper
- Basic sewing kit: scissors, needles, pins, threads, embroidery threads
- Sewing machine (if you have one)
- Coloured felt: brown/white or cream/green/red
- Beads, buttons, sequins or bells for berries
- Christmas pudding templates

Note:

If you want to re-use your jumper (without the decorations attached) after Christmas, do not machine sew the decorations to your jumper. Instead you should hand sew them onto your jumper to allow easy removal.





How to make a... Christmas Pudding Jumper









• Cut out the Christmas pudding templates (<u>loveyourclothes.org.uk/12jumpers</u>), then pin them on to felt as follows: Use brown felt for the main part of the pudding (1) Use white or cream felt for the topping (2) Use dark green felt for the holly.



 Carefully cut around your templates, cutting as close to the edge of the template as possible.





- Securely pin the brown pudding part of the design to your jumper (3).
 If you are machine sewing, use matching coloured thread and a straight stitch. Sew close to the edge all the way round (4).
 - (see note above about sewing on the designs).

 If you are hand sewing use a running stitch
 with a matching coloured thread, keeping your
 stitches close to the edge (loveyourclothes.org.
 uk/12jumpers).






How to make a... Christmas Pudding Jumper











• Pin your holly in place, then attach it by sewing down the centre of the holly in a straight line, using dark green thread. (7)



 Place your berries (red buttons/sequins/red felt circles) on to your pudding

Ensure you carefully stitch on each item using small stitches, keeping them hidden as much as



possible. (8)
